And after these things I saw four angels standing on the four corners of the earth, holding the four winds of the earth,

And I saw another angel ascending from the east, having the seal of the living God:

Of the tribe of **Simeon** were sealed twelve thousand. Of the tribe of **Levi** were sealed twelve thousand.

Of the tribe of **Issachar** were sealed twelve thousand. Of the tribe of **Zabulon** were sealed twelve thousand.

Of the tribe of **Joseph** were sealed twelve thousand. Of the tribe of **Benjamin** were sealed twelve thousand.

After this I beheld, and, lo, a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues,

stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands; And cried with a loud voice,
